Sarah Kennington related some of the history of the campaign, Committee recently added a licensed landscape architect, Sara Fairchild, to work on the visual assessment of the scenic corridor.

Sarah asked the Supervisors for a Letter of Intent, but now Land Use says they will wait until we have our presentation ready. We are pushing all these people to the job they are supposed to be doing and asking why not. The conflict between the Scenic 247 campaign and the 5000+ acres of solar applications lies in Land Use Services Department.

8. Renewable Energy Element of the County Plan

Steve Mills spoke about the importance of community presence at the May 24 Planning Commission hearing on Policy 4.10, to comment why the original wording should remain in the Renewable Energy and Conservation Element for the protection of rural communities from industrialization. He pointed out that state renewable energy production already exceeds goals; projects are being canceled and downsized, yet the developers are acting as though there is still an urgent need to build here in the desert. If this industrialization begins it will end our communities, people will be driven out, their land values reduced to nothing, as well as all the other problems these projects inflict on us.
